“God will turn it around” – Job 42:7-17

What should we know about the book of Job?

1. Job was found blameless before God.
2. Job’s helps us understand suffering and redemption.
3. Job’s friends were weak, wicked, and warped.
4. Job shows us what faith, trust, and courage looks like.
5. Job helps us to better understand the methods, motives, and mindset of God.

Main Points from Job 42

Pt. 1 - Submit to the fact that God is watching you (v.7)

Pt. 3 - Surrender to the fact that we let God down (v.7)

Pt. 4 - Surround yourself with people who honor God

(v.8)

Pt. 5 - Say a prayer for those who don't mean you well

(v.8)

Pt. 6 – Stand in the gap for those who did you wrong

(v.9)

So Eliphaz the Temanite, Bildad the Shuhite and Zophar the Naamathite did what the LORD told them; and the LORD accepted Job's prayer.

Pt. 7 - Stand on the fact that God can return what was lost (v.10)

After Job had prayed for his friends, the LORD restored his fortunes and gave him twice as much as he had before.

Pt. 8 - Strive to make God proud in times of surplus & scarcity (v.10)

After Job had prayed for his friends, the LORD restored his fortunes and gave him twice as much as he had before.

Pt. 9 - See your blessings beyond property & possessions (v.12-14)

The LORD blessed the latter part of Job's life more than the former part. He had fourteen thousand sheep, six thousand camels, a thousand yoke of oxen and a thousand donkeys. And he also had seven sons and three daughters. The first daughter he named Jemimah, the second Keziah and the third Keren-Happuch.

Pt. 10 - Share your blessings with others and don't keep it selfishly (v.15)

Nowhere in all the land were there found women as beautiful as Job's daughters, and their father granted them an inheritance along with their brothers.

Pt. 11 - Smile knowing that the best is in front of you (v.16)

After this, Job lived a hundred and forty years; he saw his children and their children to the fourth generation. And so Job died, an old man and full of years
